## SMALL LOAN (£20,000-£49,999)

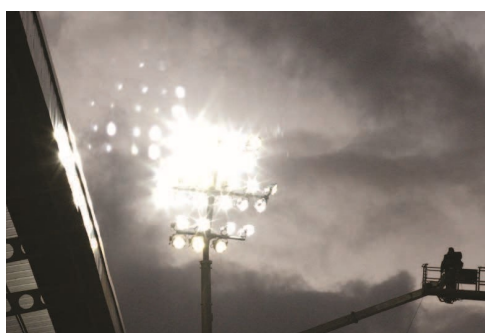
### Pitch Renovation

Carry out a super charged pitch renovation



### Floodlight Refurb/Upgrade

Refurbish or upgrade to light new playing areas or achieve match standard requirements



### Upgrade to Catering and Hospitality Facilities

Deliver an impact refurbishment of your social space and/or bar or upgrade your kitchen and catering facilities



### Mobile Catering Unit

Purchase a mobile catering unit to extend your outdoor hospitality offer for spectators and visitors



## MEDIUM LOAN (£50,000-£99,999)

### Pitch Drainage

Carry out pitch infrastructure works including the installation of new drainage



### Floodlight Installation

Install new floodlights to provide match standard lighting



### Changing Room Refurbishment / Extension

Refurbish or extend your existing changing rooms



## LARGE LOAN (£100,000-£150,000)

### Existing Project Completion

Funding that will enable clubs to achieve immediate start on planned projects that already have the majority of funding in place
